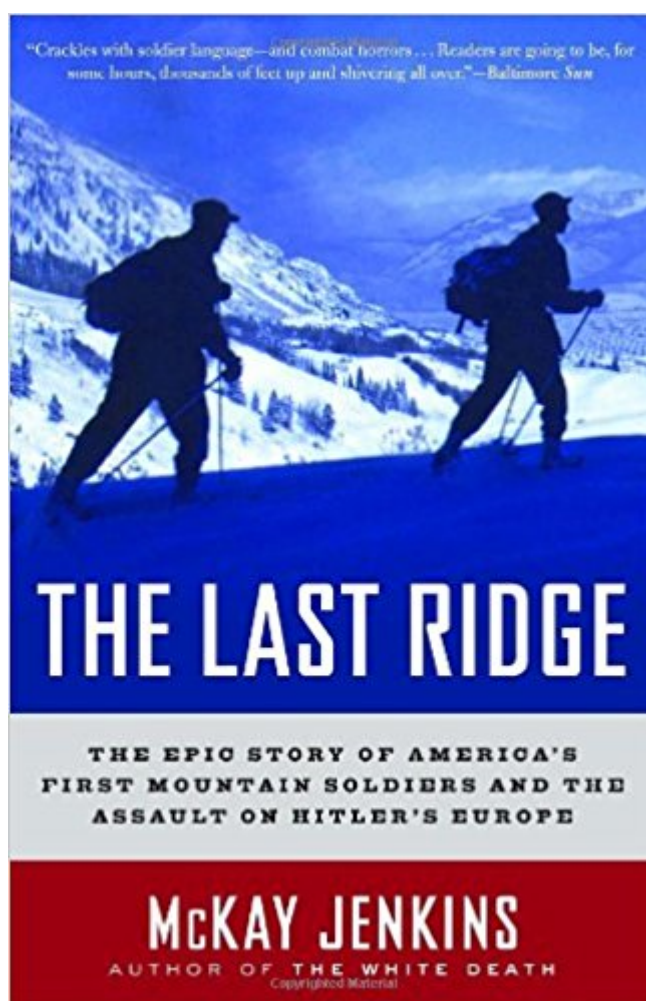


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The Last Ridge: The Epic Story Of America's First Mountain Soldiers And The Assault On Hitler's Europe



Synopsis

When World War II broke out in Europe, the American army had no specialized division of mountain soldiers. But in the winter of 1939â€”40, after a tiny band of Finnish mountain troops brought the invading Soviet army to its knees, an amateur skier named Charles Minot â€œMinnieâ€• Dole convinced the United States Army to let him recruit an extraordinary assortment of European expatriates, wealthy ski bums, mountaineers, and thrill-seekers and form them into a unique band of Alpine soldiers. These men endured nearly three years of grueling training in the Colorado Rockies and in the process set new standards for both soldiering and mountaineering. The newly forged 10th Mountain Division finally faced combat in the winter of 1945, in Italyâ€™s Apennine Mountains, against the seemingly unbreakable German fortifications north of the Gothic Line. There, they planned and executed what is still regarded as the most daring series of nighttime mountain attacks in U.S. military history, taking Mount Belvedere and the sheer, treacherous face of Riva Ridge to smash the linchpin of the German armyâ€™s lines. Drawing on unique cooperation from veterans of the 10th Mountain Division and a vast archive of unpublished letters and documents, *The Last Ridge* is written with enormous warmth, energy, and honesty. This is one of the most captivating stories of World War II, a blend of *Band of Brothers* and *Into Thin Air*. It is a story of young men asked to do the impossible, and succeeding. I've skied for more than 60 years, so the story of the origin and exploits of the 10th Mountain Division found a receptive audience in me. Jenkins does a fine job of introducing the key players, some of whom I was already familiar with thanks to my interest in skiing. His depiction of the early days -- from recruiting to the rigors of training and the earliest missions in the Aleutians -- were particularly compelling for me. The narrative and anecdotes focusing on the troops' involvement in the war in Italy graphically underscored the horrors of war, the soldiers' heroism and courage and the staggering price they paid. But what I missed, and had hoped to find, was how these skier soldiers gave birth to the modern ski industry in the U.S. There were pieces of that, but I was hoping to see the arc connecting then and now more completely drawn. Perhaps Jenkins is considering a second book on just that subject. If so, count me among those offering enthusiastic encouragement.

I enjoyed this book and the history it included in the forming of the 10th Mountain Division. The inclusion of the forming of the National Ski Patrol and how it helped the Army assemble these crack troops was very interesting. I also enjoyed learning about the personal stories of the men and their backgrounds. This was included for the men prior to and after the war. A great read and history lesson.

After learning that my grandfather had been in the 10th Mountain's 126th Engineering battalion during World War II I wanted to know more about what the 10th Mountain's history during the war. The book is well written and detailed and gives some insight about what my grandfather went through. I am not a WWII history buff but I liked the writing and the stories included in the book.

I had the wonderful opportunity to work in a Senior Retirement Community and become friends with one of the survivors of the Mountain Soldiers. He spoke at length about these men but he never got into details. I have found most of that generation always spoke highly of their elite members and rarely of themselves. I highly recommend this book to every amateur WWII historian. What these men went through was incredible. America owe these men and their spouses so much.
