I wanted to create a simple Seder for my non-Jewish friends to share the experience of Passover with them. Needless to say, it is missing important parts and is so abbreviated that it is worthless. This haggadah is missing explanations of the four questions and has no written dayenu. If I had needed or wanted recipes I would have purchased a cookbook. I do not recommend for any one.

Great book for my family. We have an extended family with about 20 people attending the Seder and need to accommodate young and old. This has enough content for me, raised conservative, and teaches the history to the children before they get restless. One of my family also used this Seder with a church group that wanted to experience a Seder and it went over very well. I recommend it for anyone with family members under 16 and for large groups (over 15).

This is a lovely book for anyone who wants to make sure all their Seder basics are covered. I thoroughly enjoyed the simple explanations (great for young kids like mine) and the step by step instructions for easy preparations. I remember my family spending days and days in preparation, only to have us kids fall asleep halfway thru the big night. This book is the perfect solution and I will definitely use it for my future Seder planning. I highly recommend it! It would also make a perfect addition to any Jewish library or cookbook collection. The recipes are easy and delicious and have now become part of our family tradition.
