

I bought this book because I am a designer in the Northeast, and I was impressed with several of the author's projects for high profile clients. From what I understand, 'Heaven is a Garden' is essentially the Cliffs Notes to Johnsen's graduate school design studio at Columbia University. I have met a few of her students, and a few of her clients. The common reaction that I get from them is that she seems to have an inner gift for visiting a site and immediately recognizing its specific strengths and weaknesses. After reading the book, it is clear to me that Johnsen makes it look easy because she is passionate about the subject and because she has spent decades developing her talents. Like any successful designer, this is a woman who pays very careful attention to every detail, and leaves nothing to chance. The book itself is a perfect example. When it arrived I was

surprised by the 8.5"x8.5" dimensions. I own two bookcases full of garden design books, and virtually all of them are oversized. When I opened it, it immediately became clear to me that the size was no accident. Neither is its sturdy construction. I can't remember the last hardcover garden book I bought that didn't have a paper jacket. Evidently Johnsen intended to write a book that any designer could keep handy and refer to continually -from someone working in their own yard, to a professional like myself. I'm putting it right into my work bag, next to my plant identification books, my 200ft tape measure and my graph paper. A common axiom in the trade is that there are no "new" ideas: "Take what you like, and make it your own." 'Heaven is a Garden' is packed with historical references, cultural inspirations and unconventional insights that prepare the reader to find the unique qualities (and avoid costly mistakes) for every site. Thanks to this book, I will be borrowing ideas from Johnsen for years to come.

If you've ever wondered why some garden spaces evoke pleasurable emotions, then Jan Johnsen's *Heaven is a Garden* is the book for you. With the use of beautiful photographs ( many of which are her inspired designs ) and descriptions, Jan artfully explains why these spaces resonate with us. Evoking the use of natural occurring shapes and principles it becomes apparent that these sensual feelings have their roots in a shared archetypal history. A must read for amateurs and professionals. Thank you Jan for a beautiful book and one that will find a prominent spot in my collection.

This book is a treasure chest of creative ideas accompanied with practical tips you can put to use in your own garden, and it also is engagingly written and filled with gorgeous photographs. A full page photo of a beautiful spot Johnsen created in a shady garden features a Japanese stone water basin and it is a testament to her genius as a landscape architect--just looking at that image on paper provides a palpable feeling of serenity. Fortunately, she shares plenty of concrete advice on how to create such magic in your own space, no matter how big or small it is. There is terrific information about choosing colors for your garden (including some scientific evidence about the effect specific colors have on our minds and emotions). She also includes a fascinating section on how rocks can play a role equal to or surpassing plants in a garden, and even gives tips about which flowers are best to plant in rock crevices. Passing along wisdom not just about creating a garden, but about life itself, Johnsen incorporates thought-provoking words that run the gamut from Einstein, Jung and Loren Eiseley to haiku and Taoist verse. But she is also quite a gifted writer herself. Describing the pleasure of being fully in the present moment in a garden, Johnson says: "We lose track of time" as we sip tea and marvel at the nuanced colors of a blossom or enjoy the dance of clouds overhead. Gardens can also signal the flow of time--"daily time, seasonal time and yearly time" by unfurling leaves and bursting buds, by nascent seed pods and frost on glistening evergreens. This is Nature's time, a quiet unspiraling of experience that envelops us wholly. In contrast, she writes, "human, mechanical time" divides our days into hours, minutes, seconds, milliseconds--exerting a constant pressure on our lives, superseding all else. In short, this book is inspiring and a total pleasure to read, whether you're a passionate gardener yourself or not.
