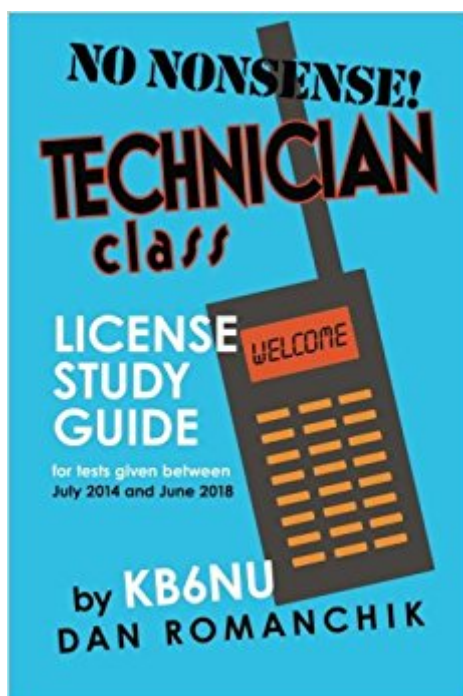

I've been an amateur radio operator for almost as long as I can remember. I love amateur radio, and even more, love sharing our hobby with others. That's my motivation for writing the books I do. The aspects of the hobby that I enjoy most include operating CW on the HF bands, building kits and homebrewing gadgets, and teaching amateur radio classes. As a person who was interested in Amateur Radio at an early age, it helped to know some of the ins and outs, however, I used another yellow book to take my No-Code Technician exam and I failed. THIS book, on the other hand, gave me in two weeks, and with less wording, what the other book couldn't get me: my Technician license. Coupled with online practice exams, my proficiency

shot up to 98% by the time I was done. I HIGHLY recommend this book for anyone interested in Amateur Radio and who wants to take 10 minutes a night to read/study and another 15 to take practice exams before they go for the actual exam. Not much controversy here, I bought this study guide for a friend. It was exactly as described, fills the bill nicely, and hopefully will encourage my friend to get his license! The requirements have changed since I got my first Ham "ticket" in 1943; the hobby has greatly expanded in scope since 1943 and I encourage all who might be interested to buy the appropriate study guide and "go for it" . You read that right: I have loved this hobby since before 1943!

This book has one purpose and that purpose only - it will allow you to pass your Technician exam with minimal fuss. I was able to do so by getting this book just one week before the exam and using one of the free study apps that the author recommends. I passed with no trouble at all. The book will teach you the correct answers, but not necessarily why they are correct. Suppose you got a Baofeng walkie-talkie as a gift or just wanted to give ham radio a try, but you're not an engineer and don't know if you want to take up ham radio as a hobby. This book is probably the easiest path to getting on the air. But if you're looking for more than that, this is not the book you want.

Before you can use a 2-way FM radio, you need to get your FCC license. It's easy these days and the test is 35 questions and requires about 75% passing ratio (26 correct). The second level is the same format to get your "Standard" license. Using this book with readily available tests - like "HamTest" or similar (now available for Android & iPhone) are the simple and quick route to get there. Highly Recommend!

It will give you the answers you need, but there is almost zero explanation on any of the topics. So if you don't already understand the topic, you have to locate another source. If you just want to pass the test, this get you there. But, not much further. Frankly, there are several apps that will do the same thing faster.

An excellent book for people who want to get an amateur-radio (ham) license. Clear and to the

point. The Technician Class license provides an easy way to get involved with radio communications. Technicians can operate on several radio bands for local and distant communications. Many of my neighbors and friends have obtained a Tech license and have handie-talkie radios for use in emergencies, and to contact local hams. We have had several emergencies that involved hams as secondary and backup communicators for fire, police, and EMT people. We were glad to have so many people available on networks to help with home evacuations, reports from evacuation centers, and so on.
