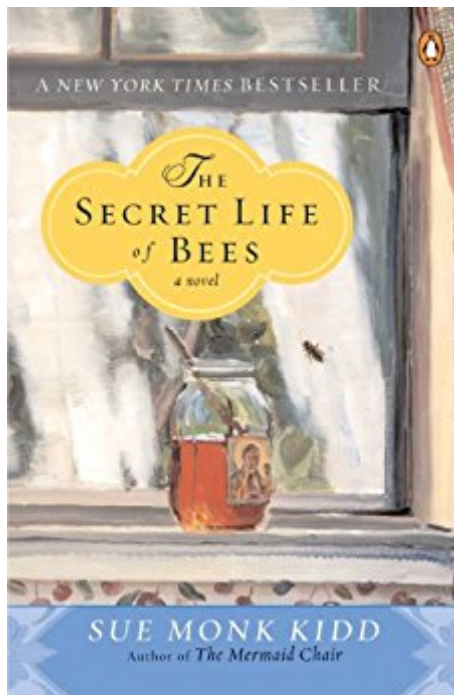

Lily sets off on her journey with little more than a photograph and the name of a town on a label. She is haunted by her mother's absence. She discovers the label belongs to a brand of honey. she is taken in by August the beekeeper whose wisdom protects her as she works out what to do. This novel is a great easy read for a holiday.
