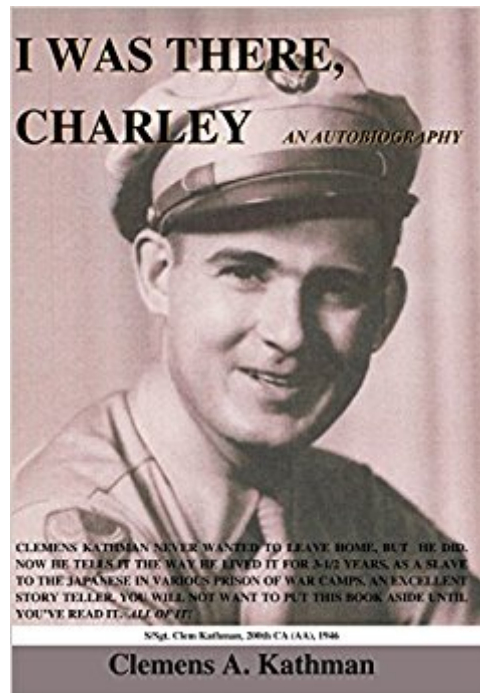




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I Was There, Charley: An Autobiography

Clemens A. Kathman, better known as "Clem", survived The Great Depression only to have his plans interrupted by Hitler, Mussolini, and Tojo. He spent more than three years as a prisoner of war before being liberated in September 1945. After being discharged, he resumed working in the newspaper field, retiring in 1981. This is his first book. --This text refers to the Paperback edition.
