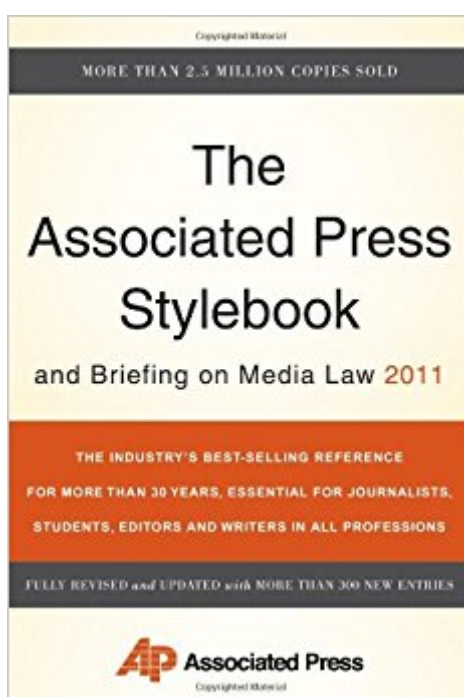


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The Associated Press Stylebook And Briefing On Media Law 2011 (Associated Press Stylebook & Briefing On Media Law)
